Making a lodge

On May 1st, 2016, West Central Florida and Gulf Ridge Council officially merged as the brand new Greater Tampa Bay Area Council. This was a very frightening and exciting time for all of us, but for the OA specifically, national has rules that applied. Every council is only to have one lodge chartered to it a year. We knew right then that we had work to do, whether we liked it or not. So at Section Conference 2016 at Camp Elmore, Seminole and Timuquan Lodge met to discuss what process we were to use thence forth. We came to a general consensus that a Transition Committee, a committee comprised of the Lodge Executive boards from both lodges with 12 total youth and two adults, was the best method of procedure to use. After months of working tirelessly with our co-officers, meeting after meeting and phone call after phone call, we successfully came up with a steady game plan for the upcoming year. August 12th, the Greater Tampa Bay Area Council Lodge was officially formed. At the time we were still without a name and totem, but it this was our opportunity to finalize them. We did a series of reviews on both lodges' strengths and weaknesses. In turn, we came to some impressive conclusions on the methods we would implement. We officially started development on our new lodge flap as well with our totem.

OA Next occurred on July 30th - August 3rd at the upcoming NOAC

location of Indiana University. The national program called for five members of each lodge to converge in one location for a unique type of training. This is where key programs were introduced for the near future. Ideas and concepts such as "Leader X", "LINK", and "#ChooseOA" to name a few. The environment created allowed for lodges from across the country to converse and speak of their best practices and then bring this information back to their respective lodges and implement it within their own program. Aside from learning how other lodges operate participants also learned of the current state of the OA and vital statistics of JTE over the whole country to give lodges something to base their performance off of. Overall, Next provided a place for people to notice the good and bad within their lodge and how to identify their pain points and the possible approaches to solve these points to better the experience within their lodge.

Operation Arrow continues a 50+ year OA legacy by providing service to the 2017 National Jamboree at the Summit Bechtel Reserve. Over 750 youth Arrowmen will support the jamboree program by joining one of three OA program areas: the Service Corps, the Trek Guides and the Indian Village. High Adventure Hank

Hey High Adventure Hank, OA High Adventure refers to special programs at each of the 4 National High Adventure Bases(Philmont, Northern Tier, Sea Base, and the Summit) that are designed specifically for members of the Order of the Arrow. Each of these programs is designed to foster a spirit of adventure while challenging members both mentally and physically and enhancing their leadership abilities and understanding of the principles of the Order of the Arrow.

At the 4 bases there are 5 programs, OA Trail Crew program at Philmont, OA Wilderness Voyage and OA Canadian Odyssey at Northern Tier, OA Ocean Adventure at the Florida Sea Base and OA Summit Experience at the Summit Bechtel Reserve.

Each program involves a Service portion and an adventure portion, since OA participants give such lasting service during each program they are able to attend these programs at a greatly reduced price compared to normal treks at each base. OA participants also return home with a renewed sense of purpose in the Order of the Arrow as well as many new friends from around the country.


