

The National Leadership Seminar is a weekend conference focusing on the skills and characteristics of leadership. It is intended primarily to enhance the leadership skills of the OA's key youth and adult members as they seek to improve their service to Scouting and the greater community. It is recommended that youth participants be at least 14 years of age, and completion of the LLD program is recommended, but not mandatory. Adults with key roles in lodge leadership are encouraged to attend in order to better understand their role as advisers to youth leadership after studying the leadership skills presented.

The Developing Youth Leadership Conference is a brand-new weekend training course for adult Arrowmen who are 21 years of age and above. Participants will learn ways to help youth leaders solve problems and analyze situations as well as the tools and personal skills that are essential for the development of effective youth leadership. DYLC is sure to help every adult arrowman become a more effective adviser.



OAHA Ocean Adventure

The Order of the Arrow Ocean Adventure has just finished its first season in the Dry Tortugas National Park. This new program provided arrowmen with a unique opportunity to partner and volunteer for the National Park Service. Our program's service is focused on preserving a pre-civil war fort, Fort Jefferson, and its surrounding incredible marine environment. The twelve OA crews have worked to build and restore a hiking trail on the top of the fort, rebuilt campsites, fixed boating docks, and provided countless other service experiences.

Some of the highlights of this summer's program included: snorkeling the reefs of the submerged fortress walls and dock ruins, fishing some of the best waters in America, open ocean kayaking, diving the remote reefs of Loggerhead Key, exploring a 260 foot, 110-year-old ship wreck, and witnessing an incredible array of wildlife. Our work has greatly improved a National Park with limited resources in just three months, and all those who experience the grandeur of this marine environment.



NOAC 2018

The 2018 National Order of the Arrow Conference is less than a year away! This NOAC will be like no other as it marks the first conference in the second century of our Order's existence. After attending the 2015 NOAC, I don't think I've experienced a better week of excitement, brotherhood, and high quality programs anywhere else. National Corner

July 19th 2017, thirty thousand scouts and scouters from around the nation descended onto the Summit Bechtel Reserve spread out by over 600 buses to begin the National Scout Jamboree. They were joined by almost six thousand staff members, and contingents from 19 other countries. The Order of the Arrow hosted its largest staff ever with over 650 arrowmen from around the country joining forces for Operation Arrow. Some of the Key Leadership for this staff came from right here in S-4!

The Order of the Arrow staff provided program to twelve thousand scouts a day, through the Day of Service and Indian Village programs. Messengers of Peace Day of Service sent six thousand scouts a day, across 10 counties in West Virginia and provided a total of **140,000** service hours. The Indian Village located on top of Garden Ground Mountain, provided a fantastic American Indian experience put on by the Order of the Arrow. Six thousand scouts were led on a hike to "the summit of the Summit" by a dedicated team of OA Trek Guides.

The event marked the 60th anniversary of the Jamboree and the 2nd at the Summit. The shows featured Bands such as the X Ambassadors (Renegades), Jessie Chris, and Grammy nominated band The Plain White T's (Hey There Delilah). Speakers at our shows were the motivational Inky Johnson, Eagle Scout and TV Host Creek Stewart, and the 45th President of the United States Donald J. Trump.

The Section officers and advisers would like to thank all the staff and participants for enabling an amazing Jamboree come to fruition.

OA National Service Grant

Since 1999, the national Order of the Arrow committee has annually selected lodges from each region to receive matching service grants. Matching grant money is given to lodges for camp or service center projects in their local council. The OA will provide up to one-half of the money for a service project, with a \$5,000 maximum amount granted for any lodge project. This grant supports the main purpose of the Order of the Arrow, "To crystallize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others." To apply for the OA Service Grant, your lodge must submit the application to the national office by October 31^{st.}
